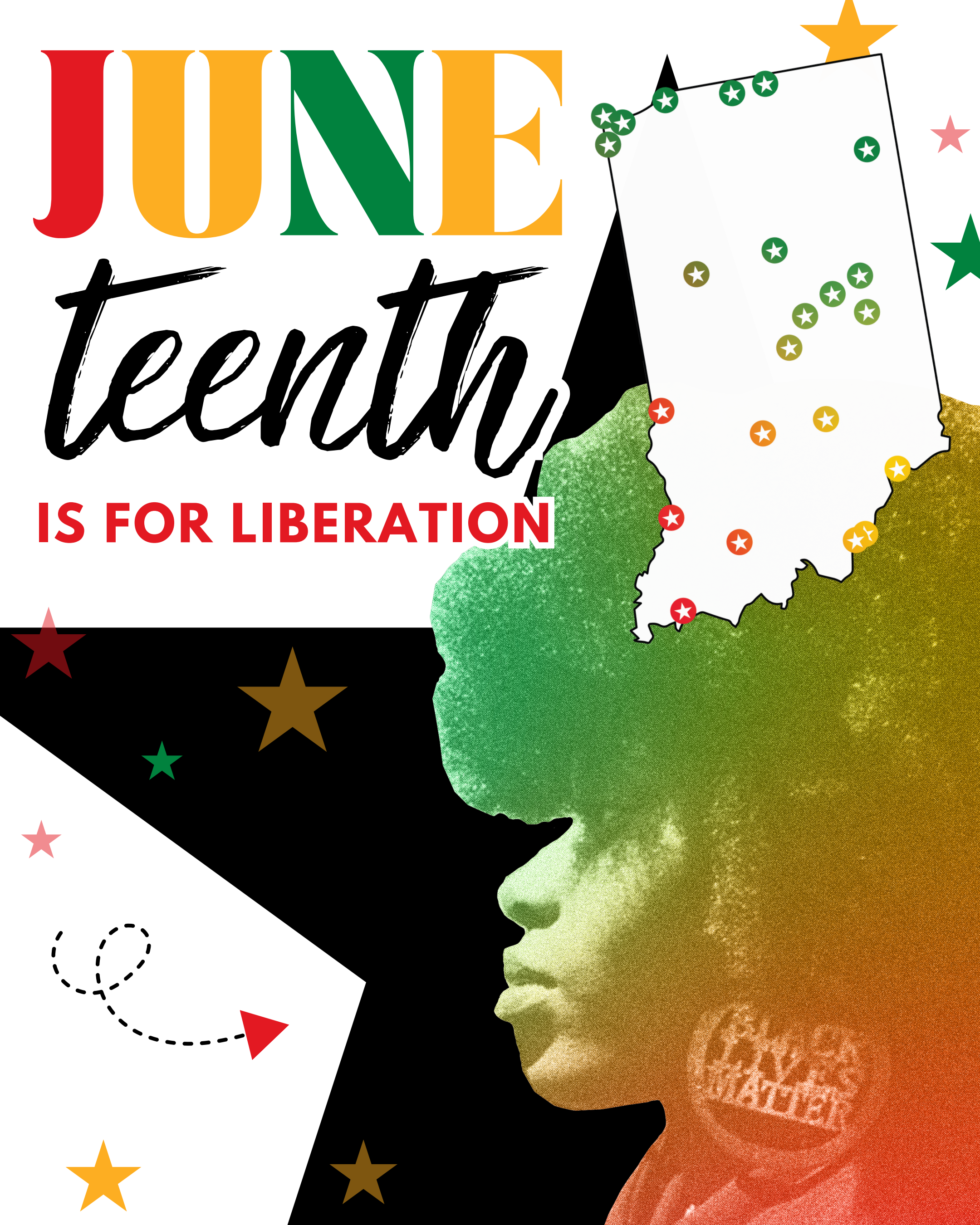


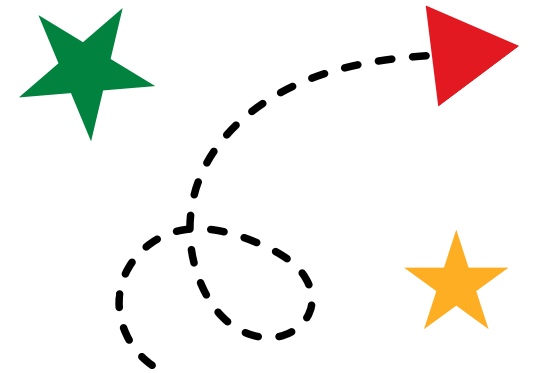

KNOW THE HISTORY



EMANCIPATION PROCLAMATION - 1863

- ★ Issued by President Lincoln as a military measure in the height of the Civil War, the Emancipation Proclamation declared that all enslaved people in Confederate territory "henceforward shall be free". The proclamation only freed those in states actively rebelling and did not address slavery in the Union or its controlled territories.

JUNETEENTH - 1865

- ★ Even though the Emancipation Proclamation was signed in 1863, it could not be implemented in places still under Confederate control. Freedom came to the last Confederate controlled territory on June 19, 1865 when Union troops arrived in Galveston Bay, Texas. Juneteenth, short for "June Nineteenth," marks this historic day.

★ 13TH AMENDMENT - 1865



The 13th Amendment, ratified in the aftermath of the Civil War, marked an end to chattel slavery in the U.S. stating; “Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, **except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted**, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction.”

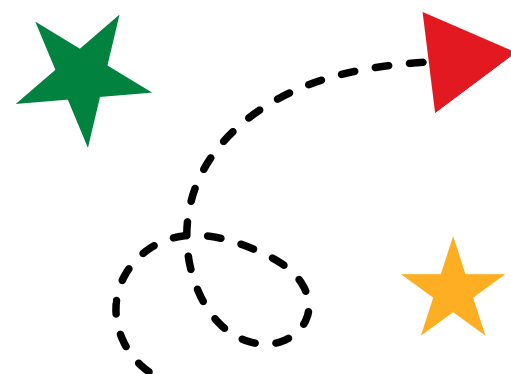

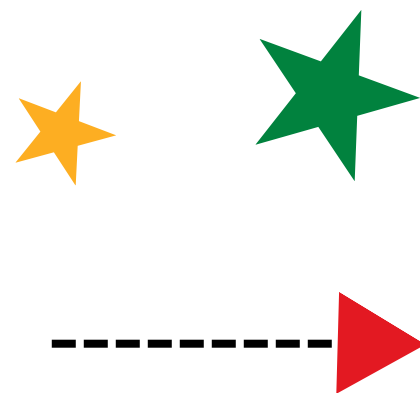

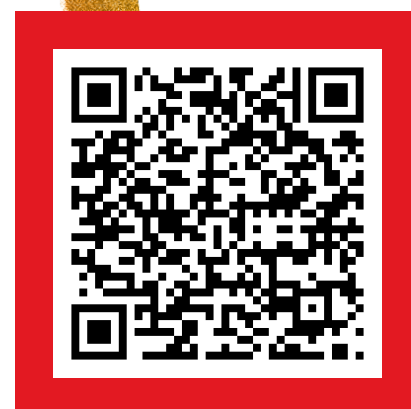

★ PAN-AFRICAN FLAG - 1920

As a way to represent black liberation in the U.S. Marcus Garvey created the Pan-African flag in 1920. The flag and its symbolic colors are still in use today: Red (for the blood shed for liberation), Black (for those within the black diaspora), and Green (for the natural wealth of Africa). As time progressed yellow (for hope, prosperity, and a bright future) also became included in traditional Juneteenth color schemes.
